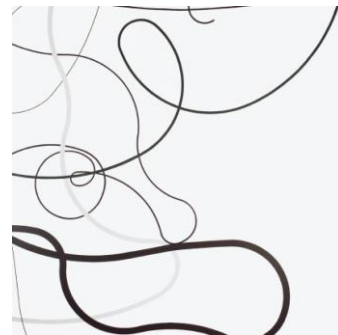
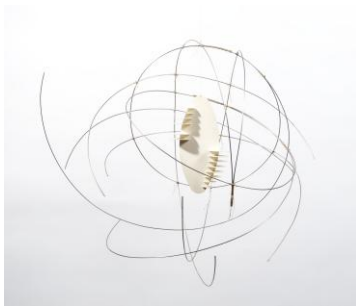


## EXHIBITIONS

### Zdeněk Sýkora – Karel Malich: Lines and Wires – A Dialogue October 2, 2009 – January 10, 2010

The concept for this exhibition, which confronts two great Czech artists: Zdeněk Sýkora and Karel Malich, was prepared by the well know German theoretic Hans-Peter Riese. The exhibition is based on comparing the evolution of both artists over the past twenty years. Sýkora will be represented by a selection of paintings, in which we see how he works with lines and colours. For each Sýkora painting there will be a "wired object" by Karel Malich, who works with lines intersecting space. The comparison of these two artists is very interesting because, even though their works are conceptually very similar, their origins are diverse.



## PERMANENT EXHIBITION

**František Kupka** (1871 – 1957) – František Kupka's works at Museum Kampa represent one of the largest and most significant collection of works by this great pioneer of abstract art. This rich collection encompasses works ranging from his student days up to his later abstract works.

**Otto Gutfreund** (1889 – 1927) – One of the most important Czech sculptors of the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century is represented in Museum Kampa by bronze cubistic and social realism sculptures.

**Modern Central European Art** (1960's –) – This unique collection is comprised of hundreds of paintings, sculptures, drawings and graphics by significant Czech, Slovak, Polish, Hungarian and Yugoslavian artists.
